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In March 1990, AutoCAD was enhanced with DWG (Drawing) technology that allowed users to create 2D drawings and 3D models using a single 2D drawing. AutoCAD 2002 (February 2002) enabled DWG to be used for interactive 2D and 3D drawing by adding 2D object-editing tools and an object-manipulation tool called "floating blocks." In October 2003, AutoCAD 2009 was introduced, which added dimensioning and annotation tools to DWG drawings, and was the first AutoCAD release to have a 64-bit architecture. AutoCAD 2010 (August 2010) introduced many new features to the DWG environment, including blocks, snap tools, and dynamic annotation. In May 2011, AutoCAD 2013 (January 2013) was introduced, which added Dynamic Input, Markups, and Node editing to the DWG environment. AutoCAD 2013 also introduced 3D modeling tools such as the Revit modeling tools, Raster to Vector tools, and tools for annotating 3D models. In January 2015, AutoCAD 2016 was released, introducing enhancements to the DWG environment and 3D modeling, as well as improvements to rendering, mobile apps, and cloud connectivity. History Overview AutoCAD was originally developed by John Walker in 1982, and sold by National CAD Systems (NCS). NCS produced AutoCAD in October 1982 as a desktop app on microcomputers with integrated graphics chips. AutoCAD was later ported to mainframe and minicomputers by companies such as CAD-Software and Division 66. In January 1990, AutoCAD for the IntelliCorp II was released. AutoCAD Simulation can be used to study the effects of wind loads on structural designs. 3D building modeling This is the process of making a 3D model of a building and can include the following phases: The first phase of modeling is with the 2D design program. An architect or interior designer will make a preliminary sketch in the designer program, then hand off the sketch to a draftsman or a set of 3D modeling programs. These programs make the model from the preliminary sketch and are known as 2D drawing programs. This modeling is often called "the first pass" or "the first draft". The second phase of modeling is to make a 3D model from the first draft. The first draft is then sent to another designer who will refine the first draft using the 3D modeling program. This modeling is called "the second pass". The computer model and the final design can be used in conjunction with the 2D design program to study the design in 3D, and to allow interaction with a builder. If the designer is not satisfied with the design after

the first or second pass, he/she may hand it back to the first designer for review. In some cases, the second designer may want to make further changes. The second designer may take the computer model and make it into a 3D model again. This model is called a third pass and is often a rework of the second pass. In the third pass, the designer may refine the design in more detail. A 3D model of a building consists of 2 parts: the exterior and the interior. On the other hand, the new California statute, added in January by state lawmakers, includes exemptions for schools, children's day camps, business offices and state facilities where children are present. Some people may still consider such sites to be overcrowded, but it's not clear whether other locations are truly appropriate for homeless encampments, such as under freeway overpasses. That is a matter for local authorities, but local officials may not want to shoulder the burden of enforcing the new law in counties that still do not have enough shelter space for their residents. At first glance, the new statute does not seem to have much practical effect on the camps currently found along the highway. The deadline for compliance with the camping ban is not until January 2018, and no camp is expected to disappear by then. But by giving the Legislature more time to consider the real problems that have generated the encampments, it is possible that the new law will help reduce the risks that the State Highway Patrol and local law enforcement face as they enforce the ban. Indeed, during the current legislative session, many advocacy groups pushed for more aggressive action on the homeless problem. The California Highway Patrol — which has put up warning signs to make people aware of the ban — also noted that the number of people sleeping along the highway had decreased in recent years. It is unclear whether the troopers have gone after people for camping in this way, but it seems likely that they have. The Assembly recently passed legislation to require such encampments to be provided shelter, which should reduce the number of people found living along the highway. But legislators also have to consider a host of problems that may have made encampments along the highway inevitable. The state law on homelessness has been changing rapidly in recent years, often reacting to emergencies in various parts of California. At a time when there are simply not enough emergency shelters to house people in need, the California Highway Patrol often does not have the resources to warn campers about the camping ban. Enforcement of the law in these circumstances is likely to become less effective over time.
